With all the changes that have been happening in Amity, the City wants to know your thoughts. Enclosed with this month's newsletter you will find our Annual Citizen Survey. This survey helps the Council and City Staff better understand where the community thinks the city may need improvement. Please take a moment to complete the survey as it only takes a few minutes to complete. The Council reviews your responses during its annual goal-setting workshop in February. ### UTILITY RATE INCREASE

On September 4, 2019, the Amity City Council approved to increase the Water base rate, effective this month. The Council annually evaluates the ability to maintain financially sustainable water and sewer utility systems and, if deemed necessary, revise the base and usage rates based upon the Portland Consumer Price Index. The current increase will raise the base rate for water by \$5.00 per month. Feel free to see how the rate was calculated at our website -

The City Council never wants to increase rates; however, the City needs to ensure that we can pay the debt obligation requirements, as well as receive adequate revenue to properly operate the water and sewer systems and make necessary improvements when needed. ### UTILITY ONLINE BILL PAY

Many of you may not be aware that you can pay your water/sewer bill online. The City uses Payment Service Network, Inc. (PSN) to process online/phone payments. Please be aware that there are small "convenience" fees associated with paying online or by phone. The fee to pay online by checking account is \$1.00 and to pay with a debit/credit card is 2.75% (\$.50 if a bill is under \$100). First time users must register and have their account number ready.
