It's the time when the children and young adults of our community will be heading back to school on foot, bikes, and in cars.

The Amity Police Department would like to encourage motorist's to always be mindful of pedestrians and bicyclists, and especially the youngest members of our community. Children do not always consider or recognize all the dangers around them. Therefore, as motorists, we must be extra vigilant.

As you know, there are a great number of Amity students who walk to and from school, many having to cross Highway 99W. Motorists are reminded to stop and stay stopped for any pedestrian who is in a marked crosswalk or crossing a street at an intersection where there is not a marked crosswalk as Oregon law requires the same response from a driver: stop and stay stopped until the pedestrian has crossed.



If a pedestrian is crossing at any intersection, you must stop and wait until the pedestrian clears your lane and the next lane before proceeding. Additionally, many of our City streets are narrow and do not have sidewalks. All of this increases the need for motorists to be attentive and aware of pedestrians and bicyclists.

Finally, for parents, it is always a good idea to have your child wear bright or reflective clothing, preferably with some aspect of reflection, as they set out for school. This is especially important when the cooler and rainier weather arrives and when the hours of daylight decrease beginning in November.

ONLINE BILL PAY

Many customers may not be aware that Amity offers a convenient way to pay your utility bill. The City uses a company called Payment Service Network (PSN) to process online/phone payments. Please be aware that there are small "convenience" fees associated with paying online or by phone. The fee to pay with your credit/debit is 2.75% (additional .50 if the bill is under \$100). If you pay with your checking account, the fee is \$1.00. First time users must register and have their account number ready. Please call 877-885-7968.
